SCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES

At Sacred Heart, we've made the most of the ATL, using it as a dynamic space for hands-on learning. Throughout the academic year, students engaged in a variety of exciting simulation activities, exploring new ideas and honing their skills. Even on CCA days, the lab was buzzing with energy as students worked to refine their robotics expertise, pushing boundaries and turning their innovative ideas into reality.
