### GRADING SYSTEM FOR SCHOLASTIC AREA

#### Classes 1 to 9 & 11

Grades are awarded on an 8-point grading scale for classes 1 to 9 & 11

### Pass Criteria for classes 9 & 10

1. In order to be declared as having passed the examination, a candidate shall obtain a grade higher than E (i.e. at least 33% marks) in all the five subjects in theory (out of 80 marks) and internal assessment (out of 20 marks) taken together.
2. A candidate will be placed under COMPARTMENT if he/she fails in any one subject.
3. A candidate will be considered FAILED, if he/she fails in two or more subjects.

### Pass Criteria for classes 11 & 12

1. In order to be declared as having passed the examination a candidate should obtain a grade higher than E (i.e. at least 33% marks) in all the five subjects in theory & practical separately in addition to 33% marks in aggregate.
2. A candidate will be placed under COMPARTMENT if he/she fails in any one subject.
3. A candidate will be considered FAILED, if he/she fails in two or more subjects.
